## **INTRODUCTORY COURSE**

First year CIPA fellows are strongly encouraged to register for the introductory public administration course taught during fall semester by Robert Schwarting, a CRP Visiting Lecturer:

*CRP 6010 – Public Administration: Theory and Practice of Public Organizations and Leaders.*

This course prepares students to work within government departments and agencies, state and local authorities, private sector organizations focused on public interest, and non-profit public benefit corporations. While the emphasis is on local and mid-size organizations, some material will address international and domestic national level organizations.

# FOUNDATION COURSEWORK

To develop a foundation of knowledge in the study of public policy, CIPA fellows take three courses in each of the following three subject areas.

- Administration, Politics, and Public Policy
- Economics and Public Finance
- Quantitative Analysis

At least one of the three courses in each subject area must be a core foundation course - a course taught by a CIPA core faculty member. These courses are to be chosen from the list of Core Foundation Courses. The remaining courses under each subject area can be chosen from the list of General Foundation Courses.

This course differs from typical intermediate-level microeconomics courses in that there will be more emphasis on the role of policy and the public sector in the economy, although understanding the role of importance of markets will remain central. It then goes on to consider various topics for managers including: education and training investments; the interdependence of capital market and labor market decisions; pay and productivity; attracting and retaining talent; workplace metrics; and pensions and retirement. # CONCENTRATION COURSEWORK

The foundation coursework addresses basic concepts of public policy and necessary analytical tools. The concentration builds on the foundation coursework and encourages students to apply their new skills in their respective areas of interest.

Each fellow selects one of the eight concentration options and focuses their studies toward the completion of a master's thesis or professional project. ## Environmental Policy

CIPA fellows in the environmental policy concentration analyze and understand the formulation and management of domestic and/or international environmental policy. Students explore the ecological and political origins of current environmental policy issues and learn how to propose resolutions via organizational analysis, budgeting, financial analysis and reporting, probability theory, applied regression analysis and microeconomics.

In addition to the nine foundation courses, CIPA fellows who select the environmental policy concentration take a minimum of five courses related to their specific area of focus. The course list below, organized thematically to facilitate course selection, is designed to help fellows develop a particular area of study, but should not limit choices. CIPA fellows may elect to substitute other relevant courses, by petition, with the approval of their advisor.

## Finance and Fiscal Policy

CIPA fellows in the finance and fiscal policy concentration grapple with fiscal issues that affect national, state and local government administrators. Students learn financial accounting, public finance, expenditure forecasting and expenditure limitations, cost-benefit analysis and trends in fiscal conditions. Students interested in this concentration generally seek positions in national, state or local financial institutions.

In addition to the nine foundation courses, CIPA fellows who select the finance and fiscal policy concentration take a minimum of five courses related to their specific area of focus. ## Human Rights and Social Justice

CIPA fellows in the human rights and social justice concentration focus on human rights, which, although often assumed to be universal, remain controversial in world politics. What are the political and economic constraints that stand in the way of the full realization of human rights? This concentration explores the relationship between politics and human rights with a social sciences approach.
